Students in Grades 3 and 6 participated in Provincial Assessments in math and Literacy in the fall. Results of those assessments were sent home to parents/guardians. These external assessments are only one piece of assessment data. Together with the ongoing classroom assessments of teachers, they provide us with information about your child's achievement that helps us make decisions about their next learning steps. If you have any questions regarding those assessments please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher.

Thank you for ensuring your child comes to school dressed properly for the weather. We do go outside even when it is cold for recess and lunch so they do need those extra clothes even if they don't need them when they are dropped off at the door in the morning.
