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Safety Tips for Halloween Night.

Trick-or-Treating Safety Tips

Children under nine years old should be supervised by an adult when trick-ortreating.

Children over nine years of age should trick-or-treat with an adult or in a group with older, responsible children.

Make sure that drivers can see your child. Use costumes with bright fabrics and decorate costumes with reflective tape. Give each child a flashlight to carry.

If your child is trick or treating without an adult, make sure he or she knows how to cross the road safely.

Your child should wear face paint or make-up instead of a mask. Make-up and face paint are better than masks because they don't block your child's ability to see.

Children should cross only at corners or pedestrian crosswalks. Children should walk, not run, from house to house and stay on the sidewalk or at the side of the



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road facing traffic.

Children should stay in well lit areas and

should only visit homes that have their outside lights turned on.

Children should not go inside homes.

Tell your children to bring their treats home before eating them. Before your children eat their candy, make sure you inspect it

Special thanks goes to our local business of Two If By Sea, located on Ochterloney Street for their gracious donation of treats for the meeting.




